Fancy sapphire is a color variety of the mineral Corundum. Corundum with a dominant color other than red (ruby), blue (sapphire), and orangy pink to pinkish orange (padparadscha) is described as fancy sapphire. One of the first known deposits of fancy sapphires was found on the island of Ceylon (Sri Lanka). Presently, however, fancy sapphires are recovered from a number of countries including Australia, Burma, Cambodia, China, India, Madagascar, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Thailand and the USA, as well as elsewhere.
